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## **South Carolina's Employment Situation December 2021**

### **I. Household Survey<sup>1</sup>**

**Employment:** The seasonally adjusted, monthly survey of households estimated the number of South Carolinians working increased to 2,320,717.

- That is an increase of 3,008 people over the November 2021 estimate.
- That is a significant increase of 97,237 people over the December 2020 estimate.

**Unemployment:** Unemployment estimates decreased to 85,090 people.

- That is a decrease of 4,377 people from the November 2021 estimate and a significant decrease of 46,492 over the December 2020 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 3.5 percent in December from 3.7 percent in November.

Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased to 3.9 percent in December from 4.2 percent in November.

**Labor force:** The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) was little changed over the month, decreasing to 2,405,807.

- That is a decrease of 1,369 people over the November 2021 estimate.
- That is an increase of 50,745 individuals over the December 2020 estimate.

### **Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted<sup>3</sup>)**

The Current Employment Survey<sup>2</sup> of businesses in South Carolina marked an increase of 2,600 nonfarm payroll jobs over the month to a level of 2,162,200.

- Industries that reported gains were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2,700); Manufacturing (+1,500); Education and Health Services (+1,100); Other Services (+500); and Leisure and Hospitality (+400).
- Decreases were observed in the Professional and Business Services (-2,100); Construction (-700); Financial Activities (-500); Information (-200); and Government (-100) industries.

From December 2020 to December 2021, South Carolina's economy has picked up 44,900 seasonally adjusted nonfarm jobs.

- Industries with strong growth were reported in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+15,900); Leisure and Hospitality (+9,000); Manufacturing (+5,600); Other Services (+5,400); Education and Health Services (+5,300); Government (+3,500); Construction (+2,300); and Information (+200).
- There were declines noticed in the Financial Activities (-2,100) and Professional and Business Services (-200) industries.

### **Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted<sup>4</sup>)**

Not seasonally adjusted, nonfarm payroll employment climbed by 2,400 from November 2021 to December 2021 for a total of 2,180,600.

- Increases were reported in the Trade, Transportation and Utilities (+8,500); Manufacturing (+2,700); Education and Health Services (+800); and Information (+100) industries.
- Decreases were reported in the Professional and Business Services (-5,400); Leisure and Hospitality (-1,800); Government (-1,100); Construction (-900); Financial Activities (-400); and Other Services (-100) industries.
- Mining and Logging remained flat.

Since December 2020, not seasonally, adjusted nonfarm jobs were up 51,000 in South Carolina.

- Industries making strong annual gains were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+17,900); Leisure and Hospitality (+12,600); Manufacturing (+6,800); Education and Health Services (+5,800); Other Services (+5,600); Government (+3,400); Construction (+1,500); and Information (+300).
- Declines were noticed in the Financial Activities (-1,500) and the Professional and Business Services (-1,400) industries.
- Mining and Logging remained flat.

<sup>1</sup>**Household Survey (Current Population Survey):** is a monthly survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This survey provides monthly statistics on employment, unemployment, and related subjects analyzed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

<sup>2</sup>**Current Employment Statistics Survey:** is a monthly survey of about 40,000 employers which yields estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry.

<sup>3</sup>**Seasonally Adjusted:** Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

<sup>4</sup>**Not Seasonally Adjusted:** Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have not been removed from these data.
